



Dental Hygiene at the 2013 Biomedical Youth Summer Camp

Recently, I was presented with the opportunity to volunteer at the Biomedical Youth Summer Camp at the University of Manitoba. The camp ran for a week from July 22nd to 26th 2013. This camp is hosted by students from the Faculty of Medicine in conjunction with the Biomedical Youth Program which combines the Alan Klass Memorial Program for Health Equity, Dept. of Community Health Sciences, Faculty of Medicine and University of Manitoba as an outreach initiative (as defined from the volunteers orientation PDF). This sparked my interest and I jumped at the opportunity to volunteer.

I was to present for a day on July 25th and my task was to present to youth ranging from grade eight to twelve regarding what a dental hygienist (DH) is, common practices performed by a DH, how DH's work inter-professionally and how to apply to the School of Dental Hygiene. I would present to two groups, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Immediately, words like "site visit" and "action plan" from Ms. Mary Bertone's

Community Health class raced through my mind. This was my chance to pull from all the knowledge that I had learned from the School of Dental Hygiene.

I attended the Biomedical Youth Summer Camp (BYSC) volunteer orientation to gain some base knowledge about the camp and the youth I would be presenting to. Then I prepared my presentation and PowerPoint accordingly. I really wanted the students at the camp to leave with a better understanding of what a DH is and maybe spark some interest about becoming a DH. My PowerPoint included many pictures and I brought along scalers, study models, a dentoform, radiographs (taken on a Dexter) and Kilgore teeth to pass around for the students to see. Initially I wanted to do a disclosing tablet activity with the students, however due to the lack of access to a sink and room constraints I decided to leave it out. I also prepared a short survey for the students to fill out after my presentation so that I could get some feedback about the presentation. It consisted of six statements with corresponding ranking based on the Likert scale and an area for free responses.

finally, the day of presentation arrived and I made my way to the Bannatyne campus at the University of Manitoba. Overall there were about 200 students at the camp ranging from grade four to twelve. There was an energetic atmosphere around the camp as the students all seemed excited to be there. The volunteers were made up of students and graduates and they were also all very enthusiastic. It felt like a great environment for the youth to learn about all things science.

I presented to a total of 30 students ranging from grade eight to twelve. They all were eager to learn and asked great questions. Their existing knowledge also surprised me which was displayed through their willingness to answer questions and share their thoughts. Comments from the surveys about the visuals that were passed around were "I really liked passing around the tools and the examples of the teeth", "I liked the models, pictures and dental tools" and "I liked learning what you actually do at the university and I liked the tools and other stuff that were passed around".

In the end, I feel like I was able to achieve both my personal goals and what the co-ordinators wanted to achieve following my presentation at the BYSC. I know this through the results of the surveys that were filled out. A total of 22 surveys were returned. I wanted the students at the camp to leave with a better understanding of what a DH is and 87% of the students agreed or strongly agreed that "I have a better understanding of what a dental hygienist is after this presentation". Also, I hoped to spark some interest in dental hygiene and although modest, there was a reported increase in interest in DH. 14% of the students agreed or strongly agreed that "I was interested in dental hygiene before this presentation" and 32% agreed or strongly agreed that "My interest in dental hygiene has increased as a result of this presentation".

One of the most rewarding examples of the interest in DH was shown through the comments on the surveys. Here is a sampling of some of the responses: "Thank you! I liked learning because I am slightly getting over my fear of dentists...", "I liked how the presenter explained how to become a dental hygienist specifically. I definitely have more interest in this career now." and "Thank you for sharing your presentation! I really enjoyed it and am starting to consider a job in the dental field".


Something I learned by doing this presentation and can improve for next time is putting more effort into including a hands-on activity. Like I previously mentioned, I had thought of including one but gave up on the idea prematurely. Some of the comments reflected this, comments such as "No activity? :(" and "I would have liked to do hands-on activities".



After the students filled out the surveys, they received a toothbrush and toothpaste provided by the Manitoba Dental Hygienists Association. Naturally, they were most excited for this part.

Overall, my experience volunteering at the 2013 Biomedical Youth Summer Camp was a very positive one. It was an experience that I learned a lot from and will be able to apply to future presentations. I am glad I was able to promote education and the great field that is dental hygiene.

Thank you to the Manitoba Dental Hygienists Association and Biomedical Youth Program for this great opportunity.
